Wayne Roswell Builder Award

This person was one of the original builders of pickleball in Ontario. They initiated a program(s) in their region (city) which has resulted in the rapid growth of pickleball. Their enthusiasm and positive energy has encouraged others to become involved in the development of the sport. They were a founder of a pickleball association in the province, which helped increase participation in the sport.

Jeff Morgan's work has been focused on young players and new Canadians. He runs the battle of the Paddle High School Pickleball Championship and the 'Net Warriors Challenge' for students.

The past 10 years have been busy for Jeff; he directed the first-ever summer Pickleball Experience at Olympia Sports Camp and has presented at the; OFSAA Women's Sports School, OFSAA Coaching Symposium, CIRA Conference, Canadian Intramural and Recreation Association Conference, Ontario Physical Literacy Summit, Retired Teachers of Ontario Conference, Hamilton District School Boards's 'Let's Move' Conference, City of Hamilton Recreation Conference, Brock University's Faculty of Education, and the City of Hamilton 'Teach the Teacher'
